Scott Dearduff served 29 years in the U.S. Air Force as a Chief Master Sergeant in the Security Forces career field for 22 years, completing his career as a Command Chief Master Sergeant at the base and command levels. During his career he performed a variety of roles in nuclear security, Presidential security, and defense of bases.

During four combat tours in Iraq and Afghanistan, he earned three Bronze Star medals, Iraq and Afghanistan campaign medals with multiple service stars, the Air Force Combat Action medal and the Legion of Merit, among his 27 military decorations.

Following military retirement, he entered the private sector security industry as a security manager where he leads an armed security force in protection of more than 4,500 employees at a full-services financial institution in Phoenix.

In 2013, Scott formed his own business, published 6 books and began a motivational speaking career.
